

ANNUAL CRA RATINGS








CONSISTENTLY CRA RATED OUTSTANDING LENDERS









SOME COMMON ELEMENTS

- Large Bank exam lenders more often consistently rated outstanding
- Lender office coverage in CRA identified distressed and/or underserved areas was associated with consistently earning outstanding CRA ratings
- There was some variation across regulators with lenders from the now defunct OTS more likely to consistently earn outstanding CRA ratings
