- Sec. 502 direct USDA is the bank
- Sec. 502 guaranteed USDA guarantees mortgages made by private lenders
- Sec. 504 loans for VLI homeowners
- Sec. 504 grants for elderly VLI homeowners

USDA SINGLE-FAMILY SELF-HELP PROGRAMS



- Many self-help, sweat equity homebuyer/builders use
 Sec. 502 direct mortgages
- Self-help sponsor organizations use Sec. 523 TA program

RURAL ECONOMIC INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT PROGRAM



- Combines 4 existing programs
 - Sec. 504 grants
 - Community facilities grants
 - Telemedicine distance learning grants
 - Broadband grants
- \$162 million
 - \$80 million for Appalachia

USDA MULTIFAMILY PROGRAMS



- Sec. 515 loans to developers of rental housing; tenants up to 80% AMI; also for preservation
- Sec. 514/516 loans and grants to developers of farmworker rental housing
- Sec. 521 Rental Assistance project-based, only for tenants in 515 and 514/516
- Sec. 538 loan guarantees to developers; tenants up to 115% AMI

USDA Rental Assistance



- All FY18 funding to renew existing contracts
- FY17 \$1.405 billion includes \$40 million advance for FY18
 - FY17 \$1.365 billion
 - FY18 \$1.385 billion
- Unlike HUD, no minimum rent

HUD IN THE 2018 BUDGET



- FY '18 proposal would cut HUD by 15%, or \$7.4 billion from current level
- Proposed cuts are many, but elimination of Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) and HOME funding are most prominent; long downward trend for both programs
- In recent public statements, Secretary Carson has noted concerns over housing being "too cozy" and called poverty a "state of mind"
- Budget eliminates Housing Trust Fund—a tool to house those of very limited means
- Budget includes policy changes around minimum rents and work eligibility to achieve savings; aligned with other portions of budget
- Sec. Carson: "This Budget reflects this Administration's commitment to fiscal responsibility while continuing HUD's core support of our most vulnerable households. We will work very closely with Congress to support the critical work of our agency as we vigorously pursue new approaches to help workeligible households achieve self-sufficiency."

FY18 HUD BUDGET KEY POINTS



- Rural and Capacity Building Focus in HUD:
 - Eliminates
 - Section 4 (LISC, Enterprise Community Partners & Habitat
 - Rural Capacity Building Program (RCB)
 - SHOP, which funds land and infrastructure for Self-Help Housing
- Rural Innovation Fund \$0
- Rural Housing and Economic Development program \$0

NOTABLE BUDGET CONTEXT



- Budget eliminates Appalachian Regional Commission, Delta Regional Commission, & Northern Border Regional Commission; rural lawmakers have noted concern
- Low-income advocates believe that cuts across agencies (e.g. food stamps, domestic violence funding, education) will combine to hurt the poor
- Administration advocates believe that the budget will rein in spending and unleash economic growth and create jobs, thereby benefitting low-income people
- Administration suggests "greater role for state and local governments and the private sector in addressing community development and affordable housing"
